



## Budgetary Thrusts, Priorities and Strategies for FY 2025

Pursuant to RA No. 9729, as amended, and other related laws, the CCC is driven by the following thrusts, priorities, and strategies to bring in the transformation of the Philippine economy to go beyond build back better and Build Right at First Sight, anchored on the principles of climate justice, common but differentiated responsibilities, and just transition.

1. Recommend/formulate legislative proposals, policies, strategies, programs on and appropriations for climate change adaptation and mitigation and other related activities;
2. Formulate and promulgate climate policies through Commission Resolutions, including input to vital policy documents related to climate change;
3. Formulate Philippine Positions on climate change negotiation issues, and decision areas in the international negotiation arena;
4. Facilitate the downscaling of the Philippines' National Adaptation Plan (NAP) for the implementation of context-specific and fit-for-purpose climate adaptation measures;
5. Facilitate the updating of the Philippine's Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC);
6. Develop national and domestic climate reports;
7. Develop climate budget tagging-related reports based on reviewed climate budget and investments;
8. Implement the green jobs certification standards and incentives system as a socio-economic and technological safeguard supporting just transition;
9. Upscale consultative mechanism with government offices and agencies, civil society organizations, private sector, and development partners;
10. Strengthen the capacity of the Philippine climate negotiators to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC);
11. Provide secretariat support to the National Panel of Technical Experts (NPTE);
12. Mobilize the People's Survival Fund (PSF) to pursue climate change adaptation measures at the local level;
13. Develop, produce, and disseminate knowledge and advocacy products and reports on climate change including information on impacts, adaptation needs, mitigation opportunities, climate finance, good practices, policies and measures, and research, among others for various targeted audiences;
14. Provide a platform for agencies and organizations to promote their various climate change adaptation and mitigation-related projects through forums, webinars and conferences;
15. Enhance local government units' capacity in formulating and updating Local Climate Change Action Plans (LCCAPs);
16. Deliver various technical advisory support and capacity-building initiatives geared towards enabling national government agencies to design and program climate change plans, activities, and programs;
17. Monitor the implementation of the National Climate Change Action Plan; and
18. Monitoring the implementation of Executive Order No. 174, s. 2014 (Institutionalizing the Philippine Greenhouse Gas Inventory Management and Reporting System).
